IN CHILD DEVELOPMENT (Child Life concentration): Students completing the Child Life concentration may satisfy the course requirements set forth by the Association of Child Life Professionals (ACLP): https://www.childlife.org/certification However, the concentration does not directly lead to the Certified Child Life Specialist (CCLS) certification upon graduation.

Students seeking CLS certification must complete a minimum of five courses (15 credit hours) to a maximum of seven courses (21 credit hours) in the Child Life concentration. Students may apply for the CCLS Certification through the ACLP upon successful completion of the Program.
